New Fund Accounting Software:

In an effort to meet the legal requirements in the State of Michigan following the Uniform Chart of Accounts, the township purchased new Fund Accounting software. It's a product of Cougar Mountain Software, called Denali. This software enables the township to properly report to the auditor, and the auditor to report the township financials to the State of Michigan which follows a process set forth by the state. This oversight insures confidence to the public that funds in the township are spent appropriately. The due diligence performed with researching the new financial software saved the township approximately \$18,000 in comparison of other software companies.

Medical Marijuana:

A hot topic in Michigan these days is all about Medical Marijuana. The Planning Commission, Zoning Board and Township Board has not made a final decision on zoning or ordinances because the State of Michigan has not come to a conclusion on the Final Rule of Regulations. It is just a matter of time that the law will become reality and the township will have to make decisions based on the best interest of our community. "The Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) has been working diligently over the last several months to promulgate emergency administrative rules, which are needed to enable the Bureau of Medical Marihuana Regulation to fully implement the Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing Act. The rules will ensure a fair and efficient regulatory structure for Michigan businesses as well as access to safety-tested medical marihuana for qualifying patients. The emergency administrative rules which are currently under legal review at the Legislative Service Bureau and the Office of Regulatory Reinvention - are expected to be issued this week".

Be safe this winter -

Snow Shoveling Tips:

Warm muscles before heading out to shovel by doing some light movements, such as bending side to side or walking in place.
